The Green Brain Cycle is a 90 minute musical composition by Michael Kieran Harvey, in collaboration with Arjun von Caemmerer and Brigita Ozolins. The work takes inspiration from Frank Herbert's 1966 futuristic ecological novel The Green Brain, in which insect intelligence evolves leading to a resistance against the devastating impact of humans on the biosphere.

The performance is in 20 movements for keyboards and piano, each named after major insect genera, and is accompanied by a series of 'concrete' poems by poet Arjun von Caemmerer.

By including this narrative anchor and integrating key passages from the book, (spoken in a strange techno-insect voice), the work provides an entry point for listeners to engage with the intense and seemingly discordant music of Harvey. Indeed, the quick movements, sharp clangs and odd mix of electronic sounds prompted imaginative visions of insect movement and debate.

Brigita Ozolins worked collaboratively with Harvey and von Caemmerer to design the set for the
world premier performance of The Green Brain Cycle at Mona Foma.

It comprised poems in gold lettering on the walls, faux lawn, hundreds of small plastic insects, live plants and trees, shiny gold beanbags and a giant green glowing orb that was suspended almost threateningly over the grand piano. The set provided a good balance between
the familiar, futuristic and otherworldly, creating a comfortable dramatically lit jungle-like atmosphere, which helped the audience relax into the performance.

The Green Brain (1966), initially published as Greenslaves, is set in the not-so-distant future, where humankind has all but succeeded in controlling life on the planet and almost completely wiped out insect life.

This composition for mixed keyboards and narrator is in twenty movements named after major
insect genera, each of which take characteristics of the particular insect morphology and behaviour to generate a musical portrait. Overall the binding idea in the cycle is the similarity of anatomy, which nevertheless, through evolutionary pressures, has resulted in infinite diversity amongst insects, and indeed amongst all of life on earth and perhaps elsewhere in the universe.

The cycle as a whole, though consisting of twenty separate pieces each based on a particular type of insect, is a contemplation on
the possibility of the spontaneous emergence of superior intelligence amongst insects when faced with the devastation unleashed on the biosphere by humans. The narrator recites the thoughts of the insect Brain, which act as a descriptive thread throughout the instrumental movements.

Each movement of the twenty-part cycle interprets the characteristics of a different kind of insect, which poet and narrator Arjun von Caemmerer reconstructed into a series of 'concrete' poems emblazoned on the walls of a jungle-like gallery space designed by installation artist Brigita Ozolins in this live recording from the original Mona Foma performance in Hobart in January 2018.

Recombinants, a series of 20 concrete poems, was written in response to Michael Kieran Harvey's The Green Brain, his keyboard opus inspired by the science fiction novel of the same name by Frank Herbert. Each of Harvey's 20 pieces are named after an arthropod.

All of the titles of the individual pieces of Recombinants derive from rearrangements of the letters of "The Green Brain". Similarly, the contents of the individual pieces are constituted entirely of re-combinations of the letters that spell the names of Harvey's selected bugs.
